# (A) Organizational structure of NCLT in India

## 1. NCLT's Constitution


- (i) Central Government (govt.) has constituted NCLT under section 408 of Companies Act (CA), 2013 (18 of 2013) effective from June 01, 2016.
- (ii) Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) has set up 1 Principal bench + 16
   Regional benches = 17 (1 + 16) benches like :
  - (a) Principal Bench at New Delhi
  - (b) Regional Bench at New Delhi
  - (c) Regional Bench at Ahmadabad
  - (d) Regional Bench at Allahabad
  - (e) Regional Bench at Bengaluru
  - (f) Regional Bench at Chandigarh
  - (g) Regional Bench at Chennai
  - (h) Regional Bench at Guwahati
  - (i) Regional Bench at Jaipur
  - (j) Regional Bench at Hyderabad
  - (k) Regional Bench at Kolkata
  - (l) Regional Bench at Mumbai
  - (m) Regional Bench at Cuttack
  - (n) Regional Bench at Jaipur
  - (o) Regional Bench at Kochi

# 4. NCLAT's Chairperson under section 407(a)

• Include a person who is holding post of chairperson of National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT)

# 5. NCLT + NCLAT's Judicial member under section 407(b)

• Include a person who is holding post of judicial member of NCLT or NCLAT + also include president or chairperson (both)

#### 6. NCLT + NCLAT's Member under section 407(c)

• Include a person who is holding post of judicial member or Technical member of NCLT or NCLAT + also include president or chairperson (both)

#### 7. NCLT's President under section 407(d)

• Include a person who is holding post of President of NCLT

#### 8. NCLT + NCLAT's Technical Member under section 407(e)

• Include a person who is holding post of Technical member of NCLT or NCLAT

#### 9. NCLT's Constitution under section 408 of CA, 2013

- (i) Central Government (Govt.) empowered to constitute NCLT consisting president + judicial member(s) + also technical member(s) (all)
- (ii) (a) Govt. required to issue notification for constituting NCLT

#### + (plus)

- (b) Also for exercising + discharging powers + functions as conferred under
   CA, 2013 + also under any other act for time being in force (all).
- 10. NCLT President's Qualifications under section 409(1) of CA, 2013
  - A person is permitted to become NCLT's president when he has already completed minimum 5 year's service as high court judge

- 11. NCLT Judicial Member's Qualifications under section 409(2) of CA 2013
  - (i) A person is permitted to become NCLT's judicial member when he was high court judge

- (ii) When he has already completed minimum 5 years as District Judge in court Or
- (iii) When he has already completed minimum 10 years as advocate of a court

12. NCLT Technical Member's Qualifications under section 409(3) of CA, 2013

(i) (a) A person is permitted to become NCLT's technical member when he has completed minimum 15 years as member of Indian Corporate Law Service (ICLS) or Indian Legal Service (ILS)

(b) Also pay scale enjoyed be equivalent to Joint Secretary to govt. of India

(ii) He has already completed minimum 15 years as Practicing Chartered Accountant (CA)

- (iii) He has already completed minimum 15 years as Practicing Cost Accountant (CA) Or
- (iv) He has already completed minimum 15 years as Practicing Company Secretary (CS)

(v) He has already completed minimum 15 years with proven ability + integrity + standing + special knowledge + experience in law or industrial finance or industrial management or administration or industrial reconstruction or investment or accountancy or labor matters or other disciplines for management or conduct of affairs or revival or rehabilitation or winding up of companies (any)

 (vi) He has already completed minimum 5 years as presiding officer for Labour Court or Tribunal or National Tribunal (any) constituted under Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (14 of 1947).

#### 13. NCLAT's Constitution under section 410 of CA, 2013

- (i) Govt. empowered to constitute NCLAT consisting 1 chairperson + number of Judicial member(s) + also number of Technical member(s) considered necessary + (plus)
- (ii) Also total number not to be exceed 11 through notification for appeal's hearings against NCLT's orders.
- 14. NCLAT chairperson's Qualifications under section 411(1) of CA, 2013
  - A person is permitted to become NCLAT's chairperson when he has been Supreme Court's judge or High Court's chief justice (any)
- 15. NCLAT Judicial Member's Qualifications under section 411(2) of CA, 2013
  - A person is permitted to become NCLAT's judicial member when he has been High Court's judge or NCLT's judicial member (any) for minimum 5 years.

# 16. NCLAT Technical Member's Qualifications under section 411(3) of CA, 2013

• A person is permitted to become NCLAT's Technical member when he has proven ability + integrity + standing + having special knowledge and experience for minimum 25 years in law or industrial finance or industrial management or administration or industrial reconstruction or investment or accountancy or labour matters or other disciplines for management or conduct of affairs or revival or rehabilitation or winding up of companies (any).

# 17. NCLAT Member's selection under section 412 of CA, 2013

- (i) NCLAT's Chairperson + Judicial Member(s) (both) are to be appointed after consultation with Chief Justice of Supreme Court of India.
- (ii) NCLAT's Judicial Member(s) + also Technical Member(s) (both) are to be appointed on selection Committee's recommendation.
  - Selection committee to include followings:
  - (a) Chief Justice of Supreme Court of India or his nominee as Chairperson
  - (b) Senior Judge of Supreme Court of India or High Court's Chief Justice as member



- (d) Secretary in Ministry of Law and Justice (MLJ) as member
- (e) Secretary in Department of Financial Services in Ministry of Finance (MoF) as member.
- (iii) MCA's secretary required to be convener of selection committee.
- (iv) Selection committee required to determine procedure for recommending persons under section 412(2).
- (v) Appointment of NCLT or NCLAT's member(s) is valid beside vacancy or defect in selection committee's constitution.

#### 18. NCLT's president + member's terms and conditions under section 413(1)+(2)

(i) (a) NCLT's President + Judicial member(s) + Technical member(s) (all) are permitted to hold office for 1 term for maximum 5 years from date of entering into NCLT's office

#### *+ (plus)*

- (b) Also eligible for re-appointment for another term for maximum 5 years
   = 10 years (5+5)
- (ii) NCLT's member(s) is permitted to hold office before attending certain age like:
  - (a) Maximum 67 years for NCLT's President
  - (b) Maximum 65 years for NCLT's Member(s)

+ (plus)

- (c) Also Minimum 50 years for NCLT's President + members (both)
- NCLT's member(s) are permitted to retain for maximum 1 year for his lien with parent cadre or Ministry or Department (any).

19. NCLAT's chairperson + member's terms and conditions - section 413(3)+(4)

(i) (a) NCLAT's Chairperson + Judicial member(s) + Technical member(s)
 (all) are permitted to hold NCLAT's office for maximum 5 years from date of entering into NCLAT's office

+ (*plus*)

- (b) Also eligible for re-appointment for another term for maximum 5 years
   = 10 years (5+5)
- (ii) NCLAT's member(s) permitted to hold office before attending certain age like:
  - (a) Maximum 70 years for NCLAT's Chairperson
  - (b) Maximum 67 years for NCLAT's Member(s)

- (c) Also Minimum 50 years for NCLAT's Chairperson + members (both)
- NCLAT's member(s) are permitted to retain for maximum 1 year for his lien with parent cadre or Ministry or Department (any).

20. NCLT + NCLAT's salaries + terms + conditions (all) under section 414

- (i) NCLT + also NCLAT's salaries + allowances + other terms and conditions of service of member(s) (all) are to be prescribed in appointment letters.
   + (plus)
- (ii) Also NCLT + also NCLAT's salaries + allowances + other terms and conditions of service of member(s) (all) are not to be lowered after their appointments.

# 21. NCLT's acting president + NCLAT's acting chairperson under section 415

(i) Senior most member is permitted to act as NCLT's president or NCLAT's chairperson till appointment of new president or new chairperson under provisions of CA, 2013 when vacancy is arises due to death or resignation or otherwise (any).

#### + (plus)

(ii) Also Senior most member is permitted to act as President or Chairperson when NCLT's president or NCLAT's chairperson unable to discharge his functions due to absence or illness or any other cause till president or chairperson resume his duty.

# 22. NCLT President + NCLAT Chairperson + member's resignation under sec. 416

(i) Resignation of President + Chairperson + Member(s) are permitted through notice with his handwriting + also addressed to govt. (all) for resigning from his office.

## 25. NCLT President + NCLAT Chairperson + member's suspension under sec. 417(3)

• Govt. is not permitted to suspend President or Chairperson or Member(s) any without receipt of report from Supreme Court's Judge under section 417(2) of CA, 2013

# 26. NCLT's power to make rules to regulate procedure for inquiries – sec. 417(4)

Govt. is permitted to make rules to regulate procedure for inquiry against misbehaviour or incapacity referred under section 417(2) of CA, 2013 after consultation with Supreme Court of India

# 27. NCLT + NCLAT staff's appointment under section 418 (1) to (3)

- (i) Govt. is permitted to appoint officers + other employees as considered necessary for exercising powers + discharging functions after consultation with NCLT + also NCLAT (all)
- (ii) NCLT's + NCLAT's officers + other employees are required to discharge their functions under general superintendence + President or Chairperson or Member's control which are already delegated.
- (iii) NCLT's + NCLAT's officers + other employee's salaries + allowances + also other conditions of services (all) to be prescribed by govt.

#### 28. NCLT's benches under section 419 (1) to (5)

- (i) Govt. is permitted to constitute number of NCLT's benches + also to be specified through notification (both)
- (ii) NCLT's principal bench is to be located at New Delhi + also to be headed by President (both).
- (iii) NCLT's each regional bench is required to have 1 Judicial member + 1
   Technical member = 2 Member(s).

- (iv) NCLT's President is permitted to constitute 1 or more than 1 special benches consisting 3 or more than 3 members + also to have majority of judicial members for disposal of rehabilitation or restructuring or reviving of company's case (any)
- (v) NCLT special bench's decision is to be taken based on majority + also to be referred to president (both) for hearings on 1 point or more than 1 point where special bench's members are equally divided in their opinions.

# 29. NCLT's orders under section 420 (1)

- *NCLT is required to pass order after giving a reasonable opportunity of being heard.*
- 30. NCLT order's rectification under section 420 (2)
  - (i) NCLT is permitted to rectify any mistake apparent from records.

+ (plus)

- (ii) Also permitted to amend any order passed when mistake is brought to notice by parties within 2 years from date for passing order
- (iii) NCLT is not permitted to amend any order when appeal already preferred under section 420(1) of CA, 2013

# 31. NCLT order's copy under section 420(3)

• NCLT is required to send a copy of each order to 100% parties passed under Section 420 (1) of CA, 2013.

# 32. NCLT order's appeal under section 421(1)

- Any person aggrieved by NCLT's order is permitted to prefer appeal before NCLAT.
- 33. NCLT order's no appeal against under section 421(2)
  - Any person aggrieved by NCLT order is not permitted to prefer appeal before NCLAT when order is passed with party's consent
- 34. NCLT order's time limit for filling appeal under section 421(3)
  - Every person covered under section 421(1) of CA, 2013 is permitted to file appeal before NCLAT in prescribed form + also with filling fee (both) within 45 days from date of order available to aggrieved person

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# 35. NCLAT order's appeal by aggrieved person under section 421(4)

NCLAT is required to pass order with confirming or modifying or setting aside (any) against appeal filed by aggrieved person under section 421(1) of CA, 2013 after giving a reasonable opportunity of being heard to appellant

# 36. NCLAT's order's copy under section 421(5)

NCLAT is required to send a copy of each order passed under Section 421(1) of CA, 2013 to NCLAT + also to 100% parties (both).

# 37. NCLT + NCLAT's expeditiously disposals under section 422(1)

NCLT + NCLAT are required to dispose 100% applications + petitions + appeals presented before them expeditiously + also not to exceed beyond 3 months from date of receipt (all).

## 38. NCLT + NCLAT's not disposed matter in 3 months under section 422(2)

(i) NCLT + NCLAT (both) are required to record reasons for not disposing of application or petition or appeal within 3 months

*+ (plus)* 

(ii) Also President or Chairperson is permitted to extend for maximum 90 days after taking into account the recorded reasons by NCLT or NCLAT for not disposing as specified under section 422(1) of CA, 2013.

# 39. NCLAT order's appeal before Supreme Court of India under section 423


• Any aggrieved person against NCLAT's order is permitted to file appeal before Supreme Court within 60 days from date of receipt by him where question of law is arising due to passing this order

# 40. NCLAT order's appeal filling extension by Supreme Court under section 423

- (i) Supreme Court is permitted to allow for extension of time for maximum 60 days when satisfied that appellant was prevented by sufficient cause from filing appeal within 60 days.
- (ii) Hence total time with extension for filling appeal before Supreme Court is 120 days (60+60).

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(i) NCLT or NCLAT's order is to be send to company's registered office

- (ii) NCLT or NCLAT's order is to be send to residence or to place of business or etc. to non company.
- 44. NCLT + NCLAT's deemed judicial proceedings + deemed civil court-sec 424(4)
  - *(i) Deemed judicial proceedings*
  - 100% proceedings before NCLT or NCLAT (any) are treated judicial proceedings as specified under section 193 + 196 + also 228 (all) of Indian Penal Code 1860 (45 of 1860)
  - (ii) Deemed Civil Court
  - NCLT + NCLAT are treated civil court as specified under section 195 + also chapter XXVI of Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 (2 of 1974) both.
- 45. NCLT + NCLAT's powers to punish for contempt under section 425
  - NCLT + NCLAT are having same jurisdictions + powers + also authorities for court's contempt similar to High Court under provision of Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 (70 of 1971) like:
  - (i) Reference to a High Court is treated (construed) as made to NCLT + also to NCLAT
  - (ii) Reference to Advocate-General under section 15 of Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 is treated Law Officers of govt.
- 46. NCLT + NCLAT's powers for delegation under section 426
  - *NCLT* + *NCLAT*'s are *permitted* to *instruct* certain person like:
  - (i) It's officers
  - (ii) It's employees
  - (iii) Any other person
  - Delegation is permitted through general order or special order + subject to satisfaction of conditions (if any) for inquiring in any matter for any proceeding before it + also to report back (all)

- 47. NCLT + NCLAT's President + Chairperson + etc. treated public servants sec 427
  - (i) NCLT's President + Members + officers + other employees

+ (plus)

(ii) Also NCLAT's Chairperson + Members + officers + other employees (all) are treated public servants under section 21 of Indian Penal Code (45 of 1860).

48. NCLT + NCLAT's members protected against actions taken in good faith - sec 428

(i) NCLT's President + Members + officers + other employees

#### + (plus)

(ii) Also NCLAT's Chairperson + Members + officers + other employees + liquidators
 + other authorized persons (all) are protected for action taken by them in good
 faith for discharging their functions against suit or prosecution or other legal
 matter for loss or damage caused or likely to be caused through any act which
 already exercised or intended to be exercised under Chapter XXVII of CA, 2013.

# 49. NCLT's powers to take help from Metropolitan or Judical Magistrate - sec 429(1)

- NCLT is permitted to take help from certain judicial authorities through requesting them in writing like:
- (i) Chief Metropolitan Magistrate
- (ii) Chief Judicial Magistrate Or
- (iii) District Collector for taking possession of property or books of accounts or other documents as required for any proceeding against sick company or winding of non sick company
- 50. Metropolitan or Judical Magistrate's duty against request from NCLT sec 429(2)
  - Chief Metropolitan Magistrate or Chief Judicial Magistrate or District Collector (any) required to take appropriate steps + also to use force (both) as considered necessary against request in writing received from NCLT under section 429(1) of CA, 2013.

- 51. Metropolitan or Judical Magistrate's liability against actions taken sec 429(3)
  - Chief Metropolitan Magistrate or Chief Judicial Magistrate or District Collector (any) not liable for a question from any court or authority or ground for actions taken after receipt of request in writing from NCLT.

## 52. NCLT + NCLAT not allowing any civil court to entertain any suit + etc. - sec 430

- (i) Any civil court is not permitted to entertain any suit or proceeding where NCLT or NCLAT is empowered to determine under Chapter XXVII of CA, 2013 or under any other law for time being in force beside having jurisdiction over it.
- + (plus) (ii) Also any Civil Court is not permitted to grant injunction for any action taken or to be taken under power as conferred under Chapter XXVII of CA, 2013 or any other law for time being in force.

#### 53. NCLT + NCLAT's 0% acts or proceedings not to invalidate for vacancy - sec 431

• 0% acts or proceedings not to invalidate merely on ground for vacancy or defect in NCLT or NCLAT's constitution (any)

# 54. NCLT + NCLAT allowing for legal representation by professionals - sec 432

- NCLT + NCLAT's are allowing professional Legal Representatives (LR) to present case like Chartered Accountants (CAs) or Company Secretaries (CSs) or Cost Accountants (CAs) or legal practitioners or other person (any).
- 55. NCLT + NCLAT allowing for Limitation Act 1963's provisions under sec 433
  - Provisions of Limitation Act, 1963 (36 of 1963) are applicable for NCLT or NCLAT's proceedings or appeals (any).
- 56. NCLT allowing proceedings transfer as pending on June 01, 2016- sec 434(1i)
  - (i) Govt. is permitted to notify certain pending matters or proceedings or cases (any) through notification like:
  - (ii) (a) 100% matters or proceedings or cases (any) pending before Company Law Board (CLB) as constituted under section 10E(1) of CA, 1956 (1 of 1956) + (plus)

(b) Also NCLT is required to dispose 100% matters or proceedings or cases (any) pending under provisions of Chapter XXVII of CA, 2013.

# 57. Appeal by aggrieved person before High Court against CLB's order - sec 434(1ii)

- (i) Aggrieved person is permitted to file appeal before High Court against CLB's order within 60 days from date of communication of decision or order for any question of law arising due to it.
- (ii) High Court is permitted to allow extension for another 60 days = 120 days
   (60+60) when satisfied that appellant was prevented by sufficient cause from filing appeal within original 60 days.

# 58. Proceedings under CA, 1956 pending before District or High Court sec 434(1iii)

 100% proceedings pending under CA, 1956 (1 of 1956) + 100% proceedings for arbitrations + compromises + arrangements + reconstructions + winding up of companies before District Court or High Court (any) are to be transferred to NCLT + also to deal from status as existed before these transferred (all).

# 59. Appellate Authority for Industrial & Financial Reconstruction (IFR) sec 434(1iv)

(i) 100% appeals will become null or void (stand abated) which already preferred before Appellate Authority for IFR or any reference made or inquiry pending before Board of Industrial and Financial Reconstruction (BIFR) or any other proceeding pending before Appellate Authority for IFR or BIFR under Sick Industrial Companies (Special Provisions) Act, 1985 (1 of 1986) immediately before commencement of Chapter XXVII of CA, 2013

#### + (plus)

- (ii) Also aggrieved company is permitted to make reference to NCLT under Chapter
   XXVII of CA, 2013 within 180 days when appeal or reference or inquiry (any)
   become null or void (stand abated)
- (iii) Company is not required to pay further fee for making reference to NCLT for appeal or reference or inquiry (any) which become null or void (stand abated).
- 60. Govt.'s powers for making rules to transfer cases pending before CLB sec 434(2)
  - Govt. is permitted to make rules to ensure timely transfer for 100% matters or proceedings or cases pending before CLB or District Courts (any) to NCLT

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# (C) Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) for Co.'s + Firms + Individuals in India

- 61. IBC's Background for Companies + Partnership Firms + LLPs + Individuals (all)
  - (i) IBC, 2016 is enacted as Indian law to create a consolidated framework for governing insolvency and bankruptcy proceedings for companies + partnership firms + LLPs + also individuals (all).
  - (ii) Certain acts were previously existed before IBC, 2016 as legislative frameworks for insolvency + also restructuring (both) like:
    - (a) Companies Act (CA) 2013
    - (b) Sick Industrial Companies (Special Provisions) Act, 1985
    - (c) Securitization and Reconstruction of Financial Assets and Enforcement of Security Interest Act, 2002
    - (d) Recovery of Debts due to Banks and Financial Institutions Act (RDDBFI Act), 1993

#### 62. IBC's History for Companies + Partnership Firms + LLPs + Individuals (all)

- (i) Bankruptcy Legislative Reforms Committee (BLRC) created by Ministry of Finance (MoF) on August 22, 2014.
- (ii) BLRC was headed by T. K. Viswanathan + also given task to him for drafting a new bankruptcy law (both).
- (iii) BLRC submitted its report + also draft bill (both) on November 04, 2015.
- (iv) Arun Jaitley (MoF) introduced IBC, 2015 in 16<sup>th</sup> Lok Sabha on December 23, 2015 after considering comments from public.
- (v) Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) was setup on Insolvency and Bankruptcy
   Code, 2015 + also draft bill was referred to it for detailed analysis (both).
- (vi) JPC submitted report + also new draft bill (both) on April 28, 2016
  - (a) Bill was passed by Lok Sabha on May 05, 2016
  - (b) Bill was passed by Rajya Sabha on May 11, 2016.

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(c) Bill was received assent from President Pranab Mukherjee + also notified in India's official gazette on May 28, 2016 (both).

#### 63. IBC versus NCLT for Insolvency Resolution (IR) plan under IBC, 2016

- (i) NCLT passed its 1<sup>st</sup> order on August 14, 2017 for CIRP of Synergies-Dooray Automotive Ltd.
- (ii) Company submitted application for IR plan on January 23, 2017.
- (iii) (a) IR plan was submitted to NCLT within 180 days as required under IBC, 2016
  - (b) NCLT has received IR plan for approval on August 02, 2017 under IBC, 2016
  - (c) NCLT's final order was passed + also uploaded on August 14, 2017
     (both) on NCLT's website.

#### 64. IBC's Insolvency Resolution (IR) Plan under IBC, 2016

- (i) Separate IR processing is designed for Companies + Partnership firms + LLPs+ also Individuals (all) under IBC, 2016
- (ii) Debtors or creditors are permitted to initiate IR process.
- (iii) (a) IR process for companies + partnership firms + LLPs + also individuals (all) are to be completed in 180 days

#### + (plus)

- (b) IR process for companies + partnership firms + LLPs + individuals (all) permitted for extension for 90 days when majority of creditors are agreed.
- (iv) (a) IR process for non partnership firm start ups + small companies + also other companies when assets are less than INR 1 crore (all) to be completed in 90 days

#### + (plus)

- (b) Also IR process is permitted for extension for 45 days when majority of creditors are agreed.
- 65. IBC's Insolvency Resolution and Bankruptcy Code (IBC Amendment) Act, 2019
  - IBC (Amendment) Act, 2019 has increased IR process's time limit from 180 days to 330 days including time already spend in legal process for completing resolution process.

- 66. IBC's Bankruptcy Board of India (BBI) as Insolvency Regulator under IBC, 2016
  - (i) IBC, 2016 has established BBI being insolvency regulator to monitor insolvency proceedings in India + to regulate 100% entities registered under it like Insolvency professional + also etc. (all).
  - (ii) BBI is required to have maximum 10 members including representatives from Ministry of Finance (MoF) + Ministry of Law (MoL) + also Reserve Bank of India (RBI) all.

# 67. IBC's Insolvency Professionals (IP) under IBC, 2016

- (i) Insolvency process is to be managed by licensed (registered) professionals. + (plus)
- (ii) Also IPs is permitted to control debtor's assets during insolvency process.
- 68. IBC's Bankruptcy and Insolvency Adjudicator (BIA) under IBC, 2016
  - *IR process is to be completed by 2 separate tribunals like NCLT + DRT for companies + partnership firms + LLPs + also individuals (all) like:*
  - (i) National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) is permitted for completing IR process for Companies + also Limited Liability Partnership (LLP) both
  - (ii) Debt Recovery Tribunal (DRT) is permitted for completing IR process for individuals + also non LLPs (both).

# 69. IBC's Time Limit under IBC Amendment Act, 2019

• Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process (CIRP) is to be completed within 330 days including 100% extensions + also litigations periods (both).

# 70. IBC versus NCLT for CIRP under IBC, 2016

- NCLT being Adjudicating Authority (AA) is empowered to receive application for IR process from certain entities like:
- (i) From financial creditors like banks + financial institutions + NBFCs + also etc.
   (all) under section 7 of IBC, 2016
- (ii) From operational creditors like supplier of goods + supplier of services + supplier of electricity + also supplier of etc (all) under section 9 of IBC, 2016

- (iii) From corporate debtors like customer of goods + customer of services + also customer of etc under section 10 of IBC, 2016.
- (iv) NCLT is not empowered to receive application from corporate debtor who was already in a CIRP at time of filling this application under section 11 of IBC, 2016.

# 71. NCLT's role after application received for CIRP under IBC, 2016

- NCLT is required to consider application for CIRP in 14 days + also required to do certain other things (both) after application for CIRP is accepted by it like:
- (i) To declare a moratorium
- (ii) To make a public announcement about CIRP
- (iii) To invite public for submission of claims
- (iv) To appoint Interim Resolution Professional (IRP).

# 72. NCLT's role for Moratorium's declaration under IBC, 2016

- (i) NCLT is permitted to declare moratorium after accepting application for CIRP till ending when NCLT approves a resolution plan under section 31(1) or it passes a liquidation order under section 33 of IBC, 2016.
- (ii) Moratorium is ensuring that CIRP has 100% freedom for settling claims
- *(iii) Moratorium is stopping institutions for litigations against corporate debtors.*
- (iv) Moratorium is suspending corporate debtor's ability to move or sell or transfer asset (any).
- (v) Moratorium is permitted to allow IRP to continue supply of goods + services
   (both) considers necessary to preserve corporate debtor's value under section
   14(2A) of IBC, 2016.
- (vi) Moratorium is not allowing company's Board of Directors (BoDs) + also to promoters (both) not to involve in management

- (vii) Moratorium is allowing IRP to seek support from company's management for day-to-day operations when considered necessary.
- NCLT (AA) is permitted to allow liquidation process when CIRP is failed for company's revival.
- 73. Prohibition for submitting resolution plan by certain persons- IBC, 2016
  - 2017 amendment is prohibiting certain persons from submitting a resolution plan when default is already made by him like:
  - (i) By wilful defaulters
  - By promoters or company's management when it outstanding is declared Non Performing Asset (NPA) by banks or financial institutions or NBFCs (any) for a period exceeding 1 year
  - (iii) By disqualified directors under CA, 2013
  - 2017 amendment is also prohibiting defaulters for property's sale during liquidation process

- (ii) NCLT has approved CIRP in Dec 2019
- (iii) Supreme court of India has delivered final decision to clear way for Arcelor Mittal India + also Nippon Steel Japan (both) to form a Joint Venture (JV) for completing takeover up to Dec 2019
- (iv) NCLT has recovered against outstanding liabilities (debts) for INR 520 billion (INR 52000 crore) equivalent to USD 6.5 billion in 2023

## 75. CIRP for Bhushan Steel Ltd. (BSL)

- (i) CIRP for BSL was submitted to NCLT on July 26, 2017 against outstanding liabilities (debts) for INR 440 billion (INR 44000 crore) equivalent to USD 5.5 billion
- (ii) NCLT has approved CIRP in May 2018
- (iii) Tata Steel Ltd. has acquired 72.65% equity shares of BSL through its wholly owned subsidiary Bamnipal Steel Ltd (BNPL) as highest bidder.
- (iv) NCLT has recovered against outstanding liabilities (debts) for INR 364 billion
   (INR 36400 crore) equivalent to USD 4.55 billion in 2023

# 76. CIRP for Bhushan Power & Steel Ltd. (BPSL)

- (i) CIRP for BPSL was submitted to NCLT in June, 2017 against outstanding liabilities (debts) for INR 492 billion (INR 49200 crore) equivalent to USD 6.2 billion
- (ii) NCLT has approved CIRP in March 2021

- (iii) JSW Steel has acquired after 4 year's litigation involving Enforcement Director
   (ED) + old owners + also Committee of Creditors (COC) all.
- (iv) NCLT has recovered against outstanding liabilities (debts) for INR 193.50 billion (INR 19350 crore) equivalent to USD 2.42 billion in 2023
